Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

What is this product?

Type

This product is a UCITS.

Term

The fund has no maturity date. The fund company has the right to terminate the management of the fund. More information can be found in the fund's prospectus.

Objectives

Investment objective The fund aims to contribute positively to climate transition in accordance with, among other things, the goal of the Paris Agreement, and to increase the value of your investment over time as well as to outperform its benchmark.

Investment policy The fund is actively managed and invests globally, primarily in green bonds in the fixed-income market. Green bonds are bonds linked to investments that aim to reduce climate and environmental impact and contribute to sustainable development.

At least 80% of the bonds that the fund invests in are green bonds, mainly rated investment grade, that aim to have a beneficial effect for the environment and the climate. Wind farms, water purification plants, clean transportation, sustainable agriculture, and waste management are examples of such sustainability activities. The fund applies positive as well as negative screening. Positive screening aims to identify companies with a good governance that contribute to sustainable development. Negative screening excludes companies that breach international norms regarding labour, anti-corruption, the environment and human rights. The return is determined by how much the fund's holdings increase or decrease in value during your holding period, which is mainly dependent on interest rates and the impact of future interest rate developments on the fund's various fixed-income securities, primarily based on maturities and creditworthiness.

The fund has sustainable investment as its objective, and is therefore classified as Article 9 according to the EU regulation SFDR (Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation). The fund follows the fund company's sustainability policy, which is available at www.sebgroup.lu/funds.

Benchmark Bloomberg Barclays MSCI Green Bond Index 1-5 years

We compare the fund's return to Bloomberg Barclays MSCI Green Bond Index 1-5 years, a green bond index. The majority of the fund's holdings are constituents of the benchmark, but they differ in weight. The fund's investment strategy does not aim to restrict how much the fund's holdings deviate from its benchmark. The fund uses the benchmark for portfolio reference and performance comparison.

Subscription and Redemption You can normally buy and sell units in the fund every Luxembourg bank day, except December 24 and 31.

Distribution Policy The unit class is distributing.

Intended retail investor

This fund may be suitable for you who intends to keep your investment for at least 2 years, and who understands that the money invested in the fund can both increase and decrease in value. It is therefore not certain that you will get back all the invested capital. In order to invest in the fund, it is not required that you have any special prior knowledge or experience of mutual funds or financial markets.

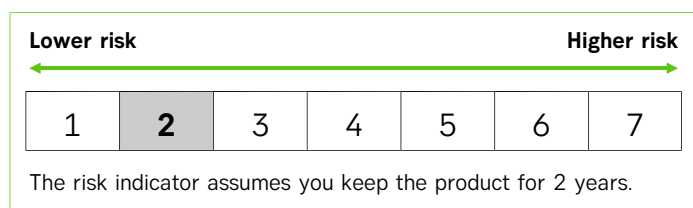

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risks



The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level.

Be aware of currency risk if you invest in a share class denominated in a currency that is different from the official currency of the country where the share class is being marketed. You will then receive payments in a different currency, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two

currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment.

Performance scenarios

The figures shown include all the costs of the product itself, but possibly not the costs of your advisor or distributor. The figures do not take into account your personal tax situation, which may also affect how much you get back.

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted.

The unfavourable, moderate, and favourable scenarios shown are illustrations using the worst, average, and best performance of the product/a suitable benchmark over the last 10 years. Markets could develop very differently in the future.

The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances.

Unfavourable: this type of scenario occurred for an investment in the product/a suitable benchmark between 29 January 2021 and 30 September 2022.

Moderate: this type of scenario occurred for an investment in the product/a suitable benchmark between 30 December 2019 and 30 December 2021.

Favourable: this type of scenario occurred for an investment in the product/a suitable benchmark between 31 August 2013 and 31 August 2015.

What happens if SEB Investment Management AB is unable to pay out?

According to law, the fund's assets may not be stored by the fund company. Instead, each fund must have a specific depositary that takes care of the safekeeping of the fund's assets. In the unlikely event that the fund company goes bankrupt, the management of the fund is taken over by the depositary. In such a scenario, there is no arranged compensation or guarantee scheme for investors in the fund.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment. If the fund is included as part of another product, e.g. unit linked insurance, there may be other costs for that product.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- in the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario,
- 10,000 EUR is invested.

(*) This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 1.0% before costs and -0.4% after costs. We may share part of the costs with the person selling you the product to cover the services they provide to you. They will inform you of the amount.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 2 years

The fund has no requirement for a minimum holding period, but since it invests in fixed income, it is suitable for a short to medium term investment horizon. You should be prepared to hold your investment in the fund for at least 2 years. You normally have the opportunity to sell your fund units all bank days in Luxembourg except December 24 and 31 without any extra fee.
