

Objectives and Investment Policy

- The aim is to provide income and moderate capital growth on your investment over time.
- The Fund will have an active asset allocation. The Fund will invest directly
 or indirectly through funds in fixed income securities (including bonds),
 equity securities, money market instruments and cash.
- The Fund will invest in high and lower quality bonds and unrated bonds. The bonds will be issued by governments, government-related entities and companies based in developed and emerging markets.
- The Fund may invest up to 50% of its assets in equity securities (i.e. shares)
 of companies of any size. The Fund will particularly invest in shares of
 companies that offer above average dividend yields and/or the potential for
 sustainable dividend growth.
- Investments in Chinese equities include China A-shares and China B-shares
 with a maximum exposure of 25% of the Fund's assets. The Fund may
 invest up to 25% of its assets in China A-shares through the Shanghai-Hong
 Kong Stock Connect and Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect and have up
 to 25% of its assets exposed to China A-shares indirectly through China Ashares Access Products (CAAP).
- The Fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in Chinese bonds through the China Interbank Bond Market (CIBM). Investment in below investment grade onshore bonds will not exceed 10% of assets.
- The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in real estate investment trusts (REITs).

- The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in convertible securities.
- The Fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in contingent convertible securities (CoCos).
- The Fund may invest up to 50% of its assets in funds (including other funds of HSBC Global Investments Funds).
- The Fund will normally be exposed to currencies of Asian (including Asia-Pacific and excluding Japan) countries as well as other emerging and developed market currencies.
- The Fund may use derivatives for hedging and cash flow management.
- The Fund may use derivatives for investment purposes but not extensively.
- Currency hedging is carried out in respect of the share class. The aim is to
 protect against exchange rate fluctuations between the share class currency
 SGD and the base currency of the Fund USD. However, exchange rate
 fluctuations between the base currency of the Fund and the currencies of
 the Fund's assets will not be protected.
- The Fund is actively managed and is not constrained by a benchmark.
- Income is reinvested.
- · You may sell your investment on most working days.
- Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 5 years.

Why is this Fund in this specific category?

This Fund is classified in category 4 because its price or simulated data has shown medium fluctuations historically.

Material risks not fully captured by the Risk and Reward Indicator:

- CoCo Bond Risk Contingent convertible securities (CoCo bonds) are comparatively untested, their income payments may be cancelled or suspended, and they are more vulnerable to losses than equities and can be highly volatile.
- Counterparty Risk The possibility that the counterparty to a transaction may be unwilling or unable to meet its obligations.
- Credit Risk A bond or money market security could lose value if the issuer's financial health deteriorates.
- Default Risk The issuers of certain bonds could become unwilling or unable to make payments on their bonds.

- Derivatives Risk Derivatives can behave unexpectedly. The pricing and volatility of many derivatives may diverge from strictly reflecting the pricing or volatility of their underlying reference(s), instrument or asset.
- Emerging Markets Risk Emerging markets are less established, and often more volatile, than developed markets and involve higher risks, particularly market, liquidity and currency risks.


